Cable & Cord Management (Priority #1 - Prevents electrocution)

Furniture & Baseboards Protection

- Wooden furniture corner guards
- Baseboard protection strips
- Block access under furniture/appliances
- Remove or protect valuable items at rabbit height

Secure loose rugs and carpeting edges

- Remove all toxic plants (complete list here)
- Secure cleaning supplies and chemicals

Week 2: Gentle Introduction

- **Daily:** Extend quiet sitting time to 30 minutes
- Begin: Offering treats through enclosure bars
- Start: Speaking softly to your rabbit during care routines
- **Observe:** Note rabbit's preferred interaction times

- **Begin:** Supervised exercise time in rabbit-proofed area
- Try: Sitting on floor during exercise time
